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DanceHouse announces 2018/19 season

Vancouver, BC / Th., March 15, 2018 - As DanceHouse steps into its second decade of programming, the series is bigger and better than ever with six extraordinary productions that span the globe in a glorious intermingling of theatre, storytelling, and movement.

This season incorporates some exciting new changes, first with our expansion to SFU Goldcorp Centre for the Arts. This intimate and technically preeminent venue is the perfect home for Australian indigenous artist **Jacob Boehme**'s **Blood on the Dance Floor**, which weaves personal and cultural histories into a powerful whole, and British choreographer **Akram Kahn**'s **Chotto Desh** which combines Bangladeshi mythology, animation and choreography into a brilliant mélange of memory and narrative.

We've also included two family-friendly presentations (*Chotto Desh* and *Viva MOMIX*) this year, so that all ages can enjoy the magic of dance together. All will enjoy **MOMIX**'s unique blend of visual theatre that combines ballet, acrobatics, and circus technique to create a universe of wild creativity and a playful effervescence.

To open the season, we welcome the French **Company Wang Ramirez**'s sensational new work, **Borderline**, that pits five dancers and one rigger against the gravitational forces of freedom and control.

We also have two performances from powerhouse Canadian women choreographers, Crystal Pite (Vancouver) and Marie Chouinard (Montreal). The world premiere of Kidd Pivot's new work *Revisor*, created with writer Jonathon Young (*Betroffenheit*) mixes classic farce with radical change. Compagnie Marie Chouinard takes inspiration from Bosch's masterpiece to fashion *Hieronymus Bosch: The Garden of Earthly Delights*.

More than just hybridity, this selection of work combines poetry, painting, stagecraft and the deeply human language of movement to cut across interdisciplinary borders and boundaries. The result is a world of dance that is diverse, open, challenging, and rich with moments of radical beauty and transcendent emotion.

Each of these presentations is paired with opportunities for the audience to participate and engage with the artists and performers through a suite of community engagement programs.

Company Wang Ramirez (France)

Borderline

October 26 & 27, 2018, 8pm

Gravity turns elastic in **Wang Ramirez**'s sensational new work **Borderline** that combines b-boy dance battles with the soaring movement of Wuxia martial arts, to trace a line between chaos and control. Fueled by the performers' stunning technical skill, and composer Jean-Philippe Barrios' (Lacrymoboy) score, choreographic duo **Sébastien Ramirez** and **Honji Wang** fluidly blend contemporary dance with diasporic identity and blunt social commentary to carve out new territory in the interstitial space between air and ground. Choreographer/dancer **Akram Khan**'s **Chotto Desh** ('small homeland' in Bangladeshi) takes a storybook view of Khan's childhood, growing up under the stern eye of his authoritarian father.

Freely mixing Kathak dance with storytelling and mime, Khan creates a series of worlds that run from the ordinary to the mythic. While themes of exclusion and identity are wound throughout, the work is light on its feet and filled with a luminous humanity that grounds the fantastical in the universal. A descendant of the Narangga and Kaurna nations of South Australia, choreographer/performer **Jacob Boehme** was diagnosed with HIV in 1998. After receiving his diagnosis, he turned to his traditional culture as a means to deal not only with his own life, but also that of his community ("gay, Blak and pos.") Grounded in Aboriginal dance and storytelling, **Blood on the Dance Floor** incorporates activism, autobiography, and performance into an incendiary work of raw and radical emotion. In honour of the 500th anniversary of the Dutch painter Hieronymus Bosch, choreographer **Marie Chouinard** creates a living canvas, embodying the seething, heaving fecundity of Bosch's most infamous masterpiece. Backed by an original score by Louis Dufort and brimming with Chouinard's visual wit, the performance unfolds in quixotic tableaus of wonderment and horror that combine erotic entanglement, stunning choreography and painterly beauty to create an experience of near-Paradisiacal ravishment. Choreographer Moses Pendleton combines visual theatre with ballet, acrobatics, and circus technique to create performance spectacles that suspend the rational mind, and replace it with wonder and a glorious sense of play.
